THE UNITED STATES ARMY WARRANT OFFICERS ASSOCIATION (USAWOA) - SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAPTER'S \$500.00 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - 2011

The USAWOA - Southern California Chapter's Scholarship Program for 2011 is announced. The goal of the program is to make awards to the most deserving candidates without putting undue emphasis on any particular asset.

Applications will be accepted from members, members' spouses, and any children, dependent stepchildren, and grandchildren, as well as anyone under the age of 23 years that has been nominated by a member of the USAWOA - Southern California Chapter. Priority will be given to family members of the organization.

Applicants must plan to attend an accredited American college, university, or vocational technical institution on a full time basis. The school must be a certifying or degree-granting institution. Note that if the allocated money is not used for the above said purpose, the applicant must return the total amount back to the Southern California Chapter within 60 days.

The application packet will consist of the following:

- 1) Application Form completed and signed.
- 2) A typewritten essay describing your goals (200 - 500 Words).
- 3) Any special circumstances that may impact your chances of attending college.
- 4) Recommendation from high school counselor (or current faculty advisor if already attending college or a trade school).
- 5) High school transcript (and college, if applicable), to include grade point averages.
- 6) National test scores if available (E.G. SAT, ACT)

All applications must be complete and received by August **1, 2011** to be considered by the Scholarship Selection Committee. The awards will be announced by September 15, 2011. Scholarships will be awarded to the student upon receipt of correspondence from the school registrar confirming registration. No partial applications will be accepted.
